Associate Superintendent Adam Hillman shared the Administrative Services department goals.

- Youth Support Services will strengthen employee connectedness, offer professional development opportunities, and explore opportunities to establish new partnerships.
- Community Schools is focused on organizing and streamlining processes within their new department.
